Title 200 Department of Enterprise Services	 The rulemaking is limited in scope. The purpose is to expand Title 200 WAC to: Establish a clear process to verify that benefits are going to small businesses as intended, including a standard compliance process. Make sure in-state businesses have increased opportunities for contracts under statewide procurement policies. Support existing strategies encouraged by the statewide Supplier Diversity Policy — such as preference points and reserved awards — to boost use of Washington small business. DES uses a point system when evaluating vendor solicitations. Preference points are added points for small businesses. Reserved awards are contracts set aside for small/Veteran-owned businesses under a multiple-award competitive solicitation. Enhance reporting on small business use in state contracting. 	We filed a CR-101 Preproposal Statement of Inquiry with the Office of the Code Reviser in September 2024. See WSR 24-19-015. We anticipate filing a proposed rule (CR-102) in May 2025.
